PROPOSAL

This application for a Rental Housing Demolition and Conversion permit proposes to demolish and replace the existing demolition of 10 existing rental dwelling units at 1894, 1898-1908, 1914-1918, and 1920 Eglinton Avenue West within a 9-storey mixed-use building on-site. The existing site contains a total of 10 rental dwelling units, with a mix of 5 one-bedroom, 3 two-bedroom, and 2 three-bedroom units, of which all have affordable rents. The owner will be providing impacted tenants with relocation assistance.

A Rental Housing Demolition and Conversion application (File No. 20 198668 NNY 08 RH) under Section 111 of the City of Toronto Act (Chapter 667 of the Municipal Code) has been made to permit the demolition of the existing 10 rental dwelling units. Under the *City of Toronto Act*, the demolition of a rental property with six or more dwelling units is prohibited without a permit obtained from the City. Decisions by City Council on the refusal or approval of the Rental Housing Demolition and Conversion application are not subject to appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal.


