## RE : PH23.3 - Modular Housing - 175 Cummer Avenue - Final Report

Members of the Planning and Housing Committee:

Volunteers from our **HousingNowTO.com** civic-tech and open-data project attended both of the on-line open houses that Councillor Filion, CreateTO, City Planning and the Housing Secretariat held for the MODULAR HOUSING site in North York in March (9<sup>th</sup>) and April (6<sup>th</sup>) of this year.

Our volunteers agree with the current sixty (60) unit proposal, and would like to lend our strong support for this Modular Supportive Housing site – and the use of a **Minister's Zoning Order (MZO)** to ensure this site on Cummer Ave is both completed and occupied before another winter arrives in Toronto.

Without this accelerated-timetable and the use of a Minister's Zoning Order (MZO) – it would often take <u>18-24</u> <u>months to approve any single-site of new build Supportive-Housing</u> via the usual City of Toronto processes, and then any incorporated Local Residents' Associations could also appeal to the Toronto Local Appeal Body (TLAB – nee OMB) which would add further years of delay to the delivery of new supportive-housing units.

The City's historical default multi-year approval and appeal process is simply untenable if the Council is in any way serious about meeting the target of "**18,000 new units of Supportive-Housing by 2030**" – which was committed to as part of the City's HOUSING 2030 plan in 2019. Your Council need to create 2,000 new units of supportive-housing every single year for the rest of the decade.

Therefore, we are asking you to please support this new Modular Supportive-Housing site at 175 Cummer Avenue in North York – and the use of a Minister's Zoning Order (MZO) to accelerate their delivery for fall 2021 move-in.

Our volunteers are always willing to share open and accurate data on affordable-housing with any City Councillor or community group that requires it to help ensure your on-going success in meeting the City of Toronto's HOUSING 2030 approved targets.
