Re: PH25.3 Housing Now – 405 Sherbourne St – Zoning Amendment

I am writing in support of the proposal by the City of Toronto to rezone 405 Sherbourne St. to permit the construction of a 26-storey apartment building that will be leased for 99 years to a non-profit housing provider.

The Co-operative Housing Federation of Toronto (CHFT) supports the efforts of Councillor Wong-Tam and City Planning to ensure that 33% to 50% of the 267 new apartments will operate as affordable housing.

One of our members, Naismith Co-op, has already indicated interest in responding to the forthcoming RFP. CHFT and the Co-operative Housing Federation of Canada will be supporting and assisting Naismith Co-op if they decide to make the application.

Developing more co-operative housing is an effective strategy to increase the supply of safe secure housing for low- and moderate-income families and individuals.

The development of 405 Sherbourne St. is an exciting opportunity to get more affordable housing in downtown Toronto. We urge the Committee to approve the rezoning the site.
