Purpose of the Service Plan for Transgender and Non Binary Youth

- The Preliminary Service Plan for Transgender and Non Binary Youth was created as a result of recommendations from the Toronto Youth Equity Strategy
- The Two-Spirit, Transgender, and Non Binary Service Plan was Council directed to support the most vulnerable youth experiencing violence
- A comprehensive service plan with the power to improve the lived realities of Two-Spirit, Trans, and Non Binary youth in Toronto



In Essence...

"When Transfeminine, Non Binary, and Transmasculine people are safe, cisgender women and girls will also experience increased safety from gender-based violence.

-Preliminary Service Plan for Transgender & Non Binary Youth



Phase I: May 2017- February 2018

General consultations with a Trans and Non Binary Youth Advisory group:

- Identified 5 thematic areas and 70 recommendations
 - 1) Legal Identification & Data Collection
 - 2) Employment
 - 3) Housing
 - 4) Mental Health
 - 5) Safety



City Staff determined that the Service Plan required more culturally inclusive consultations to better meet the needs of Two-Spirit, ABC Black, Non Binary, and Trans communities



Methodology

Community Engagement & Consultation	Research and Measurement
 Conversation guides for consultation Advisory bodies developed and engagement from impacted communities Pilot testing programming and engagement i.e. employment 	 Literature reviews and best practices for serving Two-Spirit, Trans, and Non Binary populations "Ground truth" & validate recommendations with impacted communities



Phase II: March 2018 - December 2020

Native Youth Sexual Health Network (NYSHN)

- Developed of a Youth Advisory Council to advise on consultations process
- Conducted a series of consultations to support the development of a Citywide service plan for Two-Spirit youth living in Toronto
- 18 additional recommendations were identified, highlighting the creation of a Two-Spirit and LGBTQ+ specific Service Plan

Black Lives Getting Better Together (Black LGBT) - BlackCAP & SOY Black Queer Youth, Confront Anti-Black Racism Unit (CABR)

- Conducted 3-part series aimed at identifying the specific needs and aspiration of Toronto's Black queer, Trans youth and their parents/caring adults
- BlackCAP utilizes learning from CABR's Black Lives Getting Better Together project to inform ongoing programming for community



Phase III: January 2021 – Present

BlackCAP

- Developing framework to address the change needed in workplaces for African, Caribbean, and Black (ACB) Trans, Non Binary people
- Created an advisory committee comprised of 7 members of the ABC Trans and Non Binary community
- Conducting pilot geared to ABC Trans and Non Binary people 16+ years old in order to connect to eemployers and opportunities
- Conducting consultations with members of the ABC Trans and Non Binary community to create recommendations in a Trans and Non Binary Service Plan
- Conducting a literature review to understand best practices implemented in other municipalities



Next Steps

1. Build Relationships with Two Spirit Communities

- Seek guidance from Indigenous Affairs Office
- Consultation and engagement with Two-Spirit, Trans, and Non Binary communities to validate approach and immediate next steps

2. Report Development, Q3 2022

 Development of the Two-Spirit, Trans, and Non Binary Service Plan
