Toronto Violates Senior Citizens' Rights with Secret Homeless Housing Plans

➤ On March 10, 2021 Toronto City Council declared it will place a PERMANENT homelessness project on the front lawn of WILLOWDALE MANOR seniors home, destroying their protected green parklands. The elderly community affected by the plan is mostly non-English speaking Koreans, Chinese and various other multi ethnic immigrants.



➤ The City plans to cut down dozens of mature trees and replace the parklands with "supportive modular housing". These are pre-built 350 square foot "rental units" to house the homeless.



➤ Most or all of the 64 units will house men with serious addictions and mental health issues. This will happen immediately next to the over 600 elderly at Willowdale Manor and Cummer Lodge, and next to the neighbouring patients of St. John's Rehab.

"Unfortunately, Local Councilor John Filion and Toronto Housing Executive Abigail Bond have been painting a distorted picture by trivializing the real challenges and impairments that this homeless population faces.... It's not rocket science to imagine how putting 60+ people together who all have the same intensive and complex challenges without proper intensive supports may be a recipe for disaster. ≻ The City claims this is an "emergency response" with a "fast-track" process, and has proceeded to target sites across the City with NO PUBLIC PRE-CONSULTATION. It also aims to REMOVE ALL RIGHTS OF REVIEW and APPEAL.

➤ The City also wants a special order from the Government of Ontario (a so-called "MZO"). The MZO will, as Councillor **Shelley Carroll** has said, "completely avoid the democratic process" and "strip citizens of all rights" to appeal the City decision to an independent authority, the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal (LPAT).



➤ **MPP Stan Cho**, Korean-Canadian Member of Ontario's Provincial Parliament for the Willowdale riding has released a letter he wrote the same day that Toronto approved its secretive plans on March 10, 2021. Mr. Cho urges Minister <u>Steve Clark</u> NOT to grant the MZO special order requested by the City of Toronto.



➤ Those who have raised concerns have been repeatedly ignored or attacked by local Councillor **John Filion**, a local official who has held his seat for 30 years despite the fact two thirds of the votes cast in the last election were cast **against** him.

➤ Mr. Filion's March 12 newsletter states "[they] attempted to dehumanize the homeless to justify doing nothing for them."!

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➤ Ironically, Councillor Filion is on record since as far back as 1997-98 insisting these parklands were always intended to be preserved and form part of the seniors home. In fact, he successfully opposed Toronto Housing's attempt at the time to develop only a third of the number of dwellings! A decision confirmed by the Ontario Municipal Board. The flip flop has many local residents suspicious since Mr. Filion recently sold his mansion just blocks away from this site to move to an upscale neighborhood 20kms away.

In the meantime, **MP Ali Ehsassi** Willowdale Member of Parliament in Ottawa has not responded to community concerns about Ottawa's role in this issue.
