


Broadening economic recovery in 2022

Total Employment – City of Toronto (000s)






Jobless rate returning to trend


Job Vacancy Rate – Toronto Region (vacant positions as a % of all positions)







Business Openings and Closures (000s) – Toronto CMA




Measuring the pace of return to downtown


Office Occupancy - Toronto (average weekday visitor volume, 000s)




Resurgent condo market fuels record home sales






Rising costs pressure firms and households
