BACKGROUND

As part of the review of Chapter 349, an online survey was developed to provide interested members of the public and stakeholders with the opportunity to provide feedback on a variety of proposed changes and animal relate topics. The survey was available online for 29 days from November 19, 2021 to December 17, 2021. A total of 6,191 individuals completed the survey.

The online survey, hosted by the City, did not have the scientific controls that a third-party public opinion survey would. The results of the survey should not be considered representative of the general population, but rather used to provide additional insight into public opinion in addition to the survey undertaken in collaboration with Nanos (see Attachment 3).
