Date	Impact / Development
March 16, 2020	Great Canadian Gaming closed all 25 of its gaming properties in Canada, including Casino Woodbine, as a result of COVID-19. During the extended closure, approximately 96 percent of Casino Woodbine employees were laid off, including the Community Engagement Specialist.
September 28, 2020	Casino Woodbine reopened with capacity limits upon ending of government-mandated closure.
October 9, 2020	Casino Woodbine closed again due to re-instated public health measures.
July 16, 2021	Casino Woodbine reopened with a 50 percent capacity limit when the provincial government moved Ontario into Step 3 of the COVID-19 reopening plan.
September 14, 2021	Provincial government mandated proof of vaccination in a number of settings, including casinos.
October 25, 2021	Provincial government lifted capacity limits for businesses requiring proof of vaccination, which allowed Casino Woodbine to reopen at full capacity.
December 19, 2021	Provincial government reintroduced 50 percent capacity limits on a number of indoor public settings, including casinos, due to the onset of the highly transmissible Omicron variant.
January 5, 2022	Impacts of the Omicron variant continued into 2022, with another government-mandated closure of Casino Woodbine.
January 31, 2022	Casino Woodbine reopened with a 50 percent capacity limit.
