Dear Mayor Tory and Committee Members:

The St. Lawrence Neighbourhood Association (SLNA) represents the interests of 30,000+ people who live in the neighbourhood. Our boundary on the east side is Yonge Street to Queen Street East, south on Parliament to the rail corridor. We are immediately north of our neighbours the East Waterfront Community Association. We are also founding members of the West Don Lands Committee. The St. Lawrence Neighbourhood Association (SLNA) is a not-for-profit organization incorporated in 1982. We support the staff recommendations with respect to the next phase of waterfront revitalization.

We are encouraged to see the focus on the four priorities set out in the staff report and fully support. It is important to commend the City for their leadership in being a part of this tripartite agency. Through the years we have seen the addition of the Waterfront Secretariat which has strengthened the relationship between Waterfront Toronto and the City. This agency is a great example of what can be done when three levels of government lean in and focus on waterfront revitalization.
