PROPOSAL

The applications to amend the Zoning By-law proposes to permit two additional apartment buildings of 7 and 18-storeys containing 333 residential dwelling units for the property at 63 – 73 Widdicombe Hill Boulevard. The two existing 17-storey apartment buildings are to be retained. A total of 932 vehicular parking spaces is to be provided for the existing and proposed apartment buildings.


If you wish to be notified of the decision of the City of Toronto on the passing or refusal of the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment, you must make a written request to the City Clerk Attention: Nancy Martins, Administrator, Etobicoke York Community Council, at the address, fax number or e-mail set out in this notice.

Zoning By-law Amendments Appeal: If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the City of Toronto to the Ontario Land Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Toronto before the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment is passed or refused, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision and may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Land Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal there are reasonable grounds to do so. You may submit

comments to the City Clerk, attention: Nancy Martins, Administrator, Etobicoke York Community Council, at the address, fax number or e-mail set out in this notice.

People writing or making presentations at the public meeting: The City of Toronto Act, 2006, the Planning Act, and the City of Toronto Municipal Code authorize the City of Toronto to collect any personal information in your communication or presentation to City Council or its committees.

The City collects this information to enable it to make informed decisions on the relevant issue(s). If you are submitting letters, faxes, emails, presentations or other communications to the City, you should be aware that your name and the fact that you communicated with the City will become part of the public record and will appear on the City's website. The City will also make your communication and any



personal information in it - such as your postal address, telephone number or e-mail address - available to the public, unless you expressly request the City to remove it.
