## City of Toronto Act, 2006 Public Notice Large Multi-Passenger Pedalled Vehicles on City Streets

Toronto City Council will be considering recommendations to adopt amendments to City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 545, Licensing.

It is proposed that the amendments be adopted at the City Council meeting to be held on May 11-12, 2022, or at a subsequent meeting. If option 1b is adopted by City Council, the amendments to City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 545, Licensing, Article III, Licensing of Pedicabs section 545-21 will:

1. Add a new section that will require that each owner of a large multi-passenger pedicab to maintain a minimum of \$2,000,000 in insurance and allow the City to issue no more than two pedicab business licences to large, multi-passenger pedalled vehicles, with a maximum of 16 passengers, for one year.
