City of Toronto Act, 2006 Public Notice Large Multi-Passenger Pedalled Vehicles (Quadricycles) Pilot

Toronto City Council will be considering recommendations to adopt amendments to City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 545, Licensing and Chapter 950, Traffic and Parking.

It is proposed that the amendments be adopted at the City Council meeting to be held on June 15 and 16, 2022, or at a subsequent meeting. If recommendations are adopted by City Council, the amendments to City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 950, Traffic and Parking, 950-101B will:

1. Add the term 'large quadricycle' under the definition of Vehicle.

If adopted, amendments to City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 545, Licensing, Article III, Licensing of Pedicabs section 545-1, 545-21A and 545-29.3 will:

1. Add a new definition for large quadricycles operating as pedicabs.

2. Add a section that will require that each owner of a large quadricycle to maintain a minimum of \$2,000,000 in insurance and allow the City to issue no more than eight pedicab licences to large quadricycles, with a maximum of 16 passengers per pedicab; and no more than four pedicab licences to be issued for large quadricycles for any single operating company for one year.

3. Add a section which requires pedicab licence holders which are large quadricycles to submit a proposed route for approval by the General Manager, Transportation Services. It further allows the General Manager, Transportation Services to amend or revoke any approval granted upon at least 48 hours' notice.
