Mandatory Programs – Base Funding

- 70/30 funding model maintained
- 2022 Budget Requests
 - Approved by City Council \$195.3 million gross
 - Requested of the province \$199.4 million gross
 - Allocation from the province \$192.2 million gross
- Province increased 70/30 budget by 1% or \$1.3 million
- \$14.6 million cost sharing mitigation continues

- Recap of Budget Requests for COVID-19 Recovery (100)
 - \$0.4 million for Control of Infectious Diseases/Infection Control and Communicable Disease Liaison Unit program
 - \$0.3 million for Tuberculosis program
 - \$0.1 million for Sexually Transmitted Infections program
 - \$0.2 million for Healthy Environments program
- Recap of Budget Request for Integration of COVID-19 Vaccination into Immunization Program
 - \$1.5 million for Vaccine Preventable Diseases for COVID-19 vaccination

- Recap of Budget Requests for New and Enhanced
 - > \$0.3 million for Public Health Data & Analytics (70/30)
 - \$0.7 million for Toronto Drug Strategy (70/30)
 - \$0.8 million for Mobile Supervised Consumption (100)
 - \$0.9 million for Enhanced Programming The Works (100)
 - \$0.4 million for Enhanced Data Collection & Communication for The Works (100)
 - ➤ \$0.2 million for Case and Contract Management/iPHiS Replacement (100)
 - \$0.3 million for the vehicle to support Mobile Supervised Consumption Services (100)



- Public Health Units advised to use existing budget to support recovery efforts
- Opportunity to resubmit new and enhanced program requests later in 2022

COVID -19 Budget Request

- General Program
 - Asked for \$59.2 million for January December
 - Received \$28.6 million or 48%, funding to the end of June
- Vaccine Campaign
 - Asked for \$50.5 million for January September
 - Received \$37.9 million or 75%, funding to the end of June



Ontario Seniors Dental Care Program

- Operating Allocation Received increase of \$2.8 million for expanded eligibility for a total budget of \$18.3 million
- Capital Allocation \$4.2 million for 8 capital projects for the period of April 1, 2022 to March 31, 2023

Cost Sharing Mitigation Funding

- City of Toronto has funded cost pressures at 100% in 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022
- Complete loss of the \$14.6 million in mitigation funding will result in an overall budget reduction of \$34.5 million, not including the impact of 2023 cost pressures

Recommendation

The Medical Officer of Health recommends that:

- 1. The Board of Health Budget Committee request the Board of Health ask the Province of Ontario to
 - a. confirm its commitment to provide cost-sharing mitigation funding to public health units for the duration of the COVID-19 Response and for a minimum of two years after the end of the COVID-19 Response,
 - b. continue to provide funding for COVID-19 extraordinary costs for the duration of the COVID-19 Response, and
 - c. provide an opportunity to request funding for COVID-19 Recovery efforts.
