Online Consultation Summary Report

Midtown Parks and Public Realm Social Pinpoint Mapping Exercise

1. Consultation Background

As part of the *Ready, Set, Midtown* study, the City looked at parks in the Yonge–Eglinton area to identify opportunities for improvement. The improvements aim to upgrade the function, condition, quality and amenity of parks to better meet the community's recreation, social and environmental needs and objectives.

In this context, Parks, Forestry and Recreation staff launched a public online consultation to collect public input, identify opportunities and confirm priorities for park improvements in the Yonge–Eglinton area (Figure 01).

2. Consultation Overview

The online public consultation was carried out through an interactive mapping exercise on the Social Pinpoint platform. The exercise was open to the general public and the community was invited to participate through signs placed at Midtown parks, social media ads, and councillor and community newsletters.

A map of the Midtown parks area was presented with background information on recent and ongoing park development, improvement, and recreation facility projects. The community participated by adding "pins" to the map using the following categories: show *What You Like* (green pins), *Areas of Concern* (purple pins), and *Opportunities & Suggestions* (yellow pins) to make existing parks in Midtown more enjoyable and welcoming (figure 02).

The participants were also able to interact with the provided comments through replies, likes and dislikes marks.

The consultation was open from August 4, 2021 to September 14, 2021 and counted a total of 737 interactions (including comments and replies).

3. Consultation Highlights, Findings and Key Themes

- Of the 737 interactions (comments and replies) 596 were related to *parks*, 103 to other *public areas* inside the perimeter and 38 *did not present a direct relationship* to Midtown's parks or public realm.
- Considering the overall comments and replies, the most mentioned *topics* were the ones related to *dogs* (206), followed by requests for *upgrade and improvements* (191), comments regarding *parks condition* (108) and *safety* (76).
- The 206 comments mentioning *dogs* reflected a variety of perspectives around this topic, included 75 inputs related to *requests for off leash areas*, 54 to *off leash enforcement*, 38 to *dog waste*, 32 to *fenced off leash areas* and 7 *requests not to create off leash area for dogs*.
- From the inputs requesting *upgrades or improvements*, the majority asked for *general upgrades* at specific parks or public spaces (33), adding or improving *seating* (28), adding or improving *playgrounds* (25), adding fitness pods (24) and improving signage (24).
- Besides the comments related to improvements for amenities and signage, the consultation also registered 72 specific requests for *recreation facilities* 49 related to *tennis courts*, 11 to *basketball courts*, 6 for *pickleball* areas, 4 for baseball areas and 2 for outdoor pools. From the 49 comments related to *tennis courts*, 38 are specific requests to adding *new tennis courts* at *Lawrence Park*.
- Another important finding included comments regarding *planting* (45), inputs related to issues or requesting improvements to *pedestrian access* (38), and asking for *winter maintenance* in specific parks or public spaces (33).
- A variety of comments were provided related to cyclists. There are 21 comments related to bikes and cyclists the major of them mentioning conflict between speeding bikes and pedestrians/park users (10), providing suggestions to improve cycling and cycling routes in Midtown (9) and requesting bike signage improvement (6)1.
- Regarding the inputs presented to specific **locations**, the sites with most interactions were *Sherwood Park* (188); *Eglinton Park* (70) and *Kay Gardner Beltline Park* (64).
