I'd like to submit a comment regarding the Review of City Toronto Golf Courses. I'm a resident of Ward 9 but I grew up in East York and regularly visited the Dentonia Park area to visit friends. My comment is as follows:

"I believe that Recommendation #4 in the Review should include food growers that are local to the Dentonia Park area as key stakeholders that should be consulted. The consultation report notes that demand for growing spaces is incredibly high, and given the City's existing obligations under the Toronto Food Charter and other food related policies and commitments – Black Food Sovereignty Plan (2021), Toronto Agricultural Program (2013), Milan Urban Food Pact (2015). Allow the residents of the area some space to grow food for their community."
