Cycle Toronto supports IE30.11 On-Street Electric Vehicle Charging Stations - Pilot Conclusion and Next Steps (Ward All). Providing thirty-two (32) new charging stations will contribute to reducing reliance on vehicles that use fossil fuel to operate by expediting the roll-out of publicly available on-street Electric Vehicle charging stations city-wide in the coming years.


As a community stakeholder who would like to be consulted with the preparation of the updated design guidelines for the roll-out of on-street Electric Vehicle charging infrastructure, we would like to bring forward a few recommendations for consideration to ensure that the roll out is prepared with equity of access and mobility for all road users top of mind:

- 1. That Transportation Services staff review the streets slated to receive on-street electric vehicle charging stations and make recommendations on where painted bike lanes or sharrows could be upgraded to protected bike lanes in coordination with station implementation. This measure will help ensure that vehicles using the charging stations remain in a designated charging space and will reduce conflicts and collisions with people biking.
- 2. That the City's Electric Vehicle Working Group responsible for the Electric Vehicle file include e-bikes and other electric microbility devices;
- 3. That the cost subsidies being implemented for users of electric vehicles be expanded to all vehicles including bikes, e-bikes and microbility devices that contribute to moving people away from vehicles that rely on fossil fuel usage.
