It's Ok* began in 2019 as a joint initiative between Founder & Creative Director Said Yassin and Marketing Director Alicia Brown, who is no longer with the organization.

The It's Ok* bi-monthly series has presented five events so far, highlighted by a sold-out show with American trumpeter Theo Croker and Star Nation People with Toronto's Waleed Kush Ensemble at the National Ballet Centre's Betty Oliphant Theatre in January of 2020.

While the COVID-19 pandemic interrupted our bimonthly concert plans, Said pivoted to "music and a movie" nights in outdoor locations around Toronto, which paired Toronto-based artists with thematically-similar films.

It's Ok* was incorporated as a not-for-profit by Said in November 2020.





IT'S OK* NO SPACE NO PROBLEM


A new independent Black-led and operated, interdisciplinary, multipurpose arts space, that will open its doors in Toronto's historic Queen West Neighbourhood this summer.



- This 10,000 square-foot space will include:
 - A gallery, social gathering / co-working space, and a flexible venue for projects such as installations, interactive works, and events.
- The space will host rotating programs focusing:
 - On the concept and development of work from Black grassroots emerging artists and musicians.
 - Developmental workshops for creatives to gain valuable skills and insights on creating and sustaining a creative practice.

The contributions of Black artists and Black arts-workers to culture in Toronto are priceless...

- The arts and culture sector in Toronto has been the hardest hit through the pandemic. Artists are gig-workers who lost essential income from closed venues.
- The realities of anti-Black racism have gained mainstream attention, the pandemic has made it harder for Toronto's Black artistic community to gather, create, and to support one another.
- As a Black-led arts organization, we face historical barriers to funding.

HOW IT'S GOING THE PROCESS WORKING WITH THE CITY


- The City has supported, facilitated and guided the various stages in preparing a space for occupation with a specific purpose.

WHAT IS SUCCESS? UNLOCKING BARRIERS INCLUSIVE SPACES THAT ALLOW.


FOR EVERYONE TO DREAM
