## Regarding Motion MM45.6 for the Toronto District School Board to Support an Indigenous-led Affordable Housing Project

Miziwe Biik Development Corporation (MBDC) serves the Greater Toronto Area (GTA) Indigenous community by providing opportunities for economic advancement and self-sufficiency through the creation of safe, affordable Indigenous-led housing.

In a Memorandum of Understanding between City of Toronto and MBDC dated February 28, 2022, MBDC is identified as the intermediary organization to assist in the creation of 5,200 new affordable rental units for Indigenous households as part of the HousingTO 2020-2030 Action Plan. MBDC fully supports opportunities that will allow us, in partnership with the City, to fulfil the goal of the Action Plan and ultimately create thriving communities through the provision of safe and affordable housing.

MBDC supports this motion that will allow Gabriel Dumont Non-Profit Homes (Metro Toronto) Inc. to acquire a portion of greenspace property adjacent to their 4201 and 4203 Kingston Road site, for the purpose of creating 60-80 new deeply affordable rental units for Indigenous household therefore, we respectfully request City Council approve this motion.
