PROPOSAL

The application proposes to demolish a 12-storey apartment building containing 46 rental units located at 241 Redpath Avenue. The 46 rental units are proposed to be replaced as part of the new 38-storey building comprised of 381 dwelling units. Tenant relocation and assistance is proposed to mitigate hardship.

A Rental Housing Demolition and Conversion application (20 151708 NNY 15 RH) under Section 111 of the *City of Toronto Act*, 2006 (Chapter 667 of the Municipal Code) has been submitted to permit the demolition. Under the *City of Toronto Act*, 2006, the demolition of a rental property with six or more dwelling units is prohibited without obtaining a permit from the City. Decisions by City Council on the rental housing demolition application are not subject to appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal (OLT).


