#### PROPOSAL

The application proposes to demolish 9 rental units located at 515 Chaplin Crescent. The 9 rental units are proposed to be replaced as part of a new 13-storey infill building comprised of 66 dwelling units, inclusive of replacement units. Tenant relocation and assistance is proposed to mitigate hardship. A related Zoning By-law Amendment (09 199580 NNY 16 OZ) has been submitted to permit the redevelopment.

A Rental Housing Demolition and Conversion application (10 121754 NNY 00 RH) under Section 111 of the *City of Toronto Act, 2006* (Chapter 667 of the Municipal Code) has been submitted to permit the demolition. Under the *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, the demolition of a rental property with six or more dwelling units is prohibited without obtaining a permit from the City. Decisions by City Council on the rental housing demolition application are not subject to appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal (OLT).
