## PROPOSAL

The application proposes to demolish an existing three-storey rental apartment building comprised of 31 rental dwelling units at 2674 and 2676 Yonge Street, and to redevelop the lands, along with the vacant lot at 2704 Yonge Street, with a new 9-storey mixed-use building comprised of 93 dwelling units (including 31 replacement rental units) and ground floor retail space.

A Rental Housing Demolition and Conversion application (20 194151 NNY 08 RH) under Section 111 of the *City of Toronto Act, 2006* (Chapter 667 of the Municipal Code) has been submitted to permit the demolition. Under the *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, the demolition of a rental property with six or more dwelling units is prohibited without obtaining a permit from the City. Decisions by City Council on the rental housing demolition application are not subject to appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal (OLT).


