PROPOSAL

The application proposes to demolish a total of 279 rental dwelling units—268 units at 325 Bogert Avenue, as well as a total eleven rental dwelling units in the house form buildings at 314, 315, 316 and 317 Bogert Avenue and 306 and 307 Poyntz Avenue. A total of 147 existing rental dwelling units at 325 Bogert Avenue will be retained. The application proposes to redevelop the lands with new residential buildings comprising of 1,390 new dwelling units, including replacement rental units for all 279 demolished rental units. Tenant relocation and assistance is proposed to mitigate hardship for impacted eligible tenants.

A Rental Housing Demolition and Conversion application (17 139152 NNY 23 RH) under Section 111 of the *City of Toronto Act*, 2006 (Chapter 667 of the Municipal Code) has been submitted to permit the demolition. Under the *City of Toronto Act*, 2006, the demolition of a rental property with six or more dwelling units is prohibited without obtaining a permit from the City. Decisions by City Council on the rental housing demolition application are not subject to appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal.


