City Initiated Official Plan Amendment – Yonge Street North Secondary Plan File No. 11 191325 NPS 00 TM

LOCATION OF APPLICATION: Lands generally bounded by Steeles Avenue to the north, Willowdale Avenue to the east, Cummer and Drewry Avenues to the south and Lariviere Road to the west.

APPLICANT: City of Toronto

DATE: Friday, July 8, 2022

TIME: 9:30 a.m., or as soon as possible thereafter

PLACE: Council Chamber, 5100 Yonge Street, Lower Level and by Video Conference

PROPOSAL

The City of Toronto has undertaken a comprehensive study focused on Yonge Street between Cummer/Drewry Avenues and Steeles Avenue in anticipation of the extension of the TTC's Line 1 subway into York Region. The study has resulted in a proposed amendment to the Official Plan to create the Yonge Street North Secondary Plan which affects the lands along Yonge Street as well as some lands to the east and west.

The Secondary Plan will provide a policy framework to guide future growth in the corridor that is anticipated due to the proposed subway extension. It will put in place policies to manage growth within the area including policies related to built form, massing, parkland and transportation infrastructure.

Official Plan Amendment Appeal: If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the City of Toronto to the Ontario Land Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Toronto before the proposed Official Plan Amendment is adopted the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision and may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Land Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal there are reasonable grounds to do so. 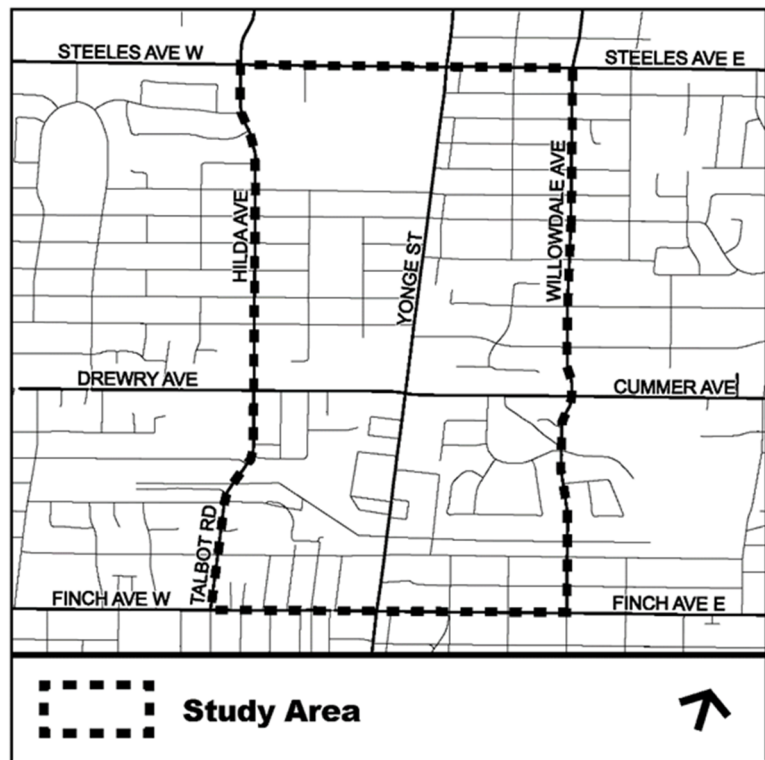
