#### **PROPOSAL**

The application proposes to demolish the existing 3-storey building at 71 Talara drive which contains twenty-nine (29) rental dwelling units, and redevelop the lands with a 23-storey residential building containing a total of 281 residential dwelling units, including 29 rental replacement units. Tenant relocation and assistance is proposed to mitigate hardship for impacted eligible tenants.

A Rental Housing Demolition and Conversion application (21 113723 NNY 17 RH) under Section 111 of the *City of Toronto Act, 2006* (Chapter 667 of the Municipal Code) has been submitted to permit the demolition. Under the *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, the demolition of a rental property with six or more dwelling units is prohibited without obtaining a permit from the City. Decisions by City Council on the rental housing demolition application are not subject to appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal.


The Community Council may request you to file an outline of your presentation with the Clerk.
