PROPOSAL

The City is proposing to amend the Official Plan and Employment Districts Zoning By-law 24982 (Progress Employment District), as amended, and to lift the Holding ("H") provisions for the property at 158 Borough Drive. The proposed amendments to the Zoning By-law for the properties at 140, 150, 156 and 158 Borough Drive are to update existing residential permissions to permit a mixed used building with two residential towers of 27 and 42-storeys with 645 dwelling units, of which between 33 percent – 50 percent of the units will be provided as affordable housing units at 158 Borough Drive. A minimum of 800 square metres of non-residential space on the ground floor is proposed for a non-profit daycare. The proposal would have a base building with a maximum height of six storeys connecting the two towers. The proposed amendment will allow for two publicly accessible pedestrian connections, one along the north edge of the property connecting Borough Drive to Albert Campbell Square. The building would have a total gross floor area of approximately 53,000 square metres and a density of 8.24 times the area of the lot.

The proposed amendment to the Official Plan would exempt the subject lands from Policy 6.3 of the Scarborough Centre Secondary Plan to bring the parkland dedication rate for the site in accordance with the Official Plan policies regarding parkland that are in force at the time of issuance of the first above-grade building permit.



FURTHER INFORMATION

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the City of Toronto on the proposed Official Plan Amendment and passing or refusal of the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment, you must make a written request to the City Clerk, Attention: Nancy Martins, Administrator, Planning and Housing Committee, at the address, fax number or e-mail set out in this notice.

Official Plan and Zoning By-law Amendment Appeal: If a person or public body would

otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision



of the Council of the City of Toronto to the Ontario Land Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Toronto before the proposed Official Plan Amendment is adopted or refused and before the Zoning By-law Amendment is passed or refused, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision and may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Land Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal there are reasonable grounds to do so. You may submit comments to the City Clerk, Attention: Nancy Martins, Administrator, Planning and Housing Committee, at the address, fax number or e-mail set out in this notice.

People writing or making presentations at the public meeting: The *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, the *Planning Act*, and the City of Toronto Municipal Code authorize the City of Toronto to collect any personal information in your communication or presentation to City Council or its committees.

The City collects this information to enable it to make informed decisions on the relevant issue(s). If you are submitting letters, faxes, e-mails, presentations or other communications to the City, you should be aware that your name and the fact that you communicated with the City will become part of the public record and

will appear on the City's website. The City will also make your communication and any personal information in it - such as your postal address, telephone number or e-mail address - available to the public, unless you expressly request the City to remove it.
