### PROPOSAL

The purpose of this City-initiated Zoning By-law Amendment and Draft Plan of Subdivision is to facilitate a mixed-use development, including affordable rental housing, two new public streets, a new public park and the preservation of environmentally sensitive lands on the City-owned property at 770 Don Mills Road. Development of the property is being advanced as part of the City's Housing Now initiative.

The recommended Zoning By-law Amendment will permit a development across two blocks comprising residential units, indoor and outdoor amenity space, a new Toronto District School Board elementary school, child care and retail space. Development will include two buildings with three towers, having maximum heights ranging from approximately 37 to 48 storeys. The recommended Zoning By-law Amendment implements the City Council adopted Don Mills Crossing Secondary Plan (Official Plan Amendment 404), which sets the development vision for the site. Redevelopment of the site in accordance with the recommended Zoning By-law Amendment and Draft Plan of Subdivision will result in the provision of a new approximately 1,065 square metre public park, and two new public streets connecting Eglinton Avenue East to Don Mills Road. The recommended Zoning By-law Amendment will facilitate the development of approximately 1,254 dwelling units, of which a minimum of 33 percent will be provided as affordable rental housing units.

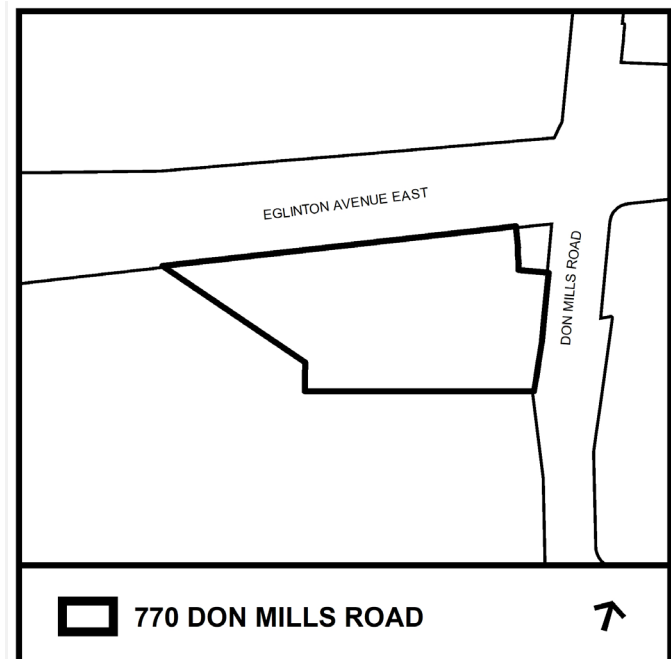

**Zoning By-law Amendment and Draft Plan of Subdivision Appeal:** If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the City of Toronto to the Ontario Land Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Toronto before the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment and Draft Plan of Subdivision are passed or refused, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision and may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Land Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal there are reasonable grounds to do so. You may submit comments to the City Clerk, Attention: Nancy Martins, Administrator, Planning and Housing Committee, at the address, fax number or e-mail set out in this notice.

**People writing or making video presentations at the public meeting:** The *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, the *Planning Act*, and the City of Toronto Municipal Code authorize the City of Toronto to collect any personal information in your communication or presentation to City Council or its committees.

The City collects this information to enable it to make informed decisions on the relevant issue. If you are submitting letters, faxes, e-mails, presentations or other communications to the City, you should be aware

that your name and the fact that you communicated with the City will become part of the public record and will appear on the City's website. The City will also make your communication and any personal information in it - such as your postal address, telephone number or e-mail address - available to the public, unless you expressly request the City to remove it.
