The Mayor and Members of Toronto City Council are deeply saddened to learn of the passing of former Toronto City Councillor Anthony (Tony) O'Donohue on February 20, 2022 at the age of 89.

Tony O'Donohue was born in Ireland and worked as professional engineer in Britain, the Middle East and Canada before his career in politics.

He was a long-time City Councillor, serving on both Toronto City Council and Metropolitan Toronto Council for a combined 25 years, chairing many of the major committees of with a special interest in environmental issues. He was also a member of the Board of Commissioners of Toronto Hydro, Commissioner of the Toronto Transit Commission, Chair of the Toronto District Heating Corporation and Chair of the Toronto Atmospheric Fund.

Tony O'Donohue will be remembered for having a special way of connecting with people. His legacy will live on through his family and as a published author of two books.
