Later in 2009, Mrs. Kandasamy's son, Thivakaran, lost his life and she was taken to an internment camp until she was able to gain release and eventually come to Canada aboard the MV Sun Sea.

In Canada, Mrs. Kandasamy continued to advocate for justice and accountability in Sri Lanka. In addition to speaking with various Canadian and world leaders, Mrs. Kandasamy stood before the United Nations Human Rights Council and bravely shared her story.

Mrs Kandasamy's commitment to the Tamil community will be deeply missed and long remembered. She is survived by her daughter, Vathany Victor, and granddaughter, Jennifer Victor.
