Thanks to their innovative and entrepreneurial spirit, Norman Sue Bakery Ltd has grown over 42 years to become an internationally known merchant with products sold in numerous local grocery stores. Their children now manage the business.

Lynette was also a significant force for good in the community. She helped recent immigrants to integrate into their new environment, and offered some of them jobs. Lynette also supported many charities, including community organizations such as Guyana Christian charities, The Caribbean Children's foundation, and Lions International among others. Lynette leaves behind 10 grandchildren and one great grandchild.
