

Introduction of Overnight On-Street Permit Parking - Brilliant Court

SUMMARY

This staff report is about a matter that Community Council has delegated authority from City Council to make a final decision.

Transportation Services is recommending that overnight on-street permit parking be introduced on Brilliant Court, between Sandhurst Circle and the end of Brilliant Court from 12:01 a.m. to 7:00 a.m., daily.

Residents requested the implementation of overnight on-street permit parking on Brilliant Court to accommodate their long-term parking needs.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Director, Permits and Enforcement, Transportation Services recommends that:

1. Scarborough Community Council authorize parking by permit only on a street name basis, from 12:01 a.m. to 7:00 a.m. daily on the even side of Brilliant Court, between Sandhurst Circle and a point 118 metres further east.
2. Scarborough Community Council authorize no parking on the odd side of Brilliant Court, between Sandhurst Circle and a point 118 metres further east.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The estimated funding to implement permit parking is \$300 which is available within Transportation Services 2022 Operating Budget. The maximum annual revenue that could potentially be generated if all parking spaces are occupied by a permit holder is \$1,400.00.

DECISION HISTORY

This report addresses a new initiative.

COMMENTS

A request was received from the Ward Councillor, on behalf of area residents, to introduce the overnight on-street permit parking program on Brilliant Court, between Sandhurst Circle and the end of Brilliant Court to accommodate their long-term parking needs without being subject to tagging by Toronto Police Service, Parking Enforcement Unit.

Existing Conditions

Brilliant Court, between Sandhurst Circle and the end of Brilliant Court, is characterized by the following conditions:

- It is a two-lane, east-west roadway
- It operates two-way traffic on a pavement width of approximately 8.6 metres
- There is no TTC service.

The parking regulations on Brilliant Court, between Sandhurst Circle and the end of Brilliant Court, within the subject section are as follows:

North side

- Maximum of three-hour parking at all times.

South side

- Maximum of three-hour parking at all times.

A map of the area is included in Attachment 1.

Polling Results

In accordance with Municipal Code Chapter 925, a poll was conducted to determine if there is support for the installation of overnight on-street permit parking. Ballots were mailed out on October 26, 2021 to all residents on Brilliant Court, between Sandhurst Circle and a point 118 metres further east with the last day for filing a response being November 24, 2021. A poll will be considered valid when at least 25 percent of the ballots mailed have been returned to the City Clerk. In order for a poll to be deemed positive 50 percent plus one of returned ballots must be in favour of the request. For Brilliant Court, 27 ballots were returned which represents a response rate of 45 percent. Table 1 summarizes the level of support for the installation of overnight on-street permit parking.

Table 1: Poll Results - Support for Permit Parking - Brilliant Court

Response Type	Number of ballots	Percentage
In Favour	16	59%
Opposed	10	37%
Spoiled Ballot	1	4%

As the majority of the ballots returned were in favour of implementing permit parking and the required minimum response rate was met, the poll was deemed to be positive.

The Ward Councillor has been advised of the recommendations in this report.
