NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING

PROPOSAL

This application proposes the demolition of six (6) existing rental dwelling units at 287 Davenport Road and 141, 143 and 145 Bedford Road. As all of the existing units had rents that exceeded mid-range rents at the time of application, the units are not required to be replaced in the new development. However, the owner will be providing eligible tenants with a tenant assistance plan to lessen hardship associated with having to move.

A Rental Housing Demolition and Conversion application (19 244085 STE 11 RH) under Section 111 of the City of Toronto Act (Chapter 667 of the Municipal Code) has been made to permit the demolition. Under the City of Toronto Act, the demolition of a rental property with six or more dwelling units is prohibited without a permit obtained from the City. Decisions by City Council on the refusal or approval of the Rental Housing Demolition and Conversion application are not subject to appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal.

A related application for a Zoning By-Law Amendment (19 244078 STE 11 OZ) was approved by the Ontario Land Tribunal on September 9, 2021.


