PROPOSAL

The application proposes to demolish the residential rental buildings at 161 Parliament Street and 90-94 Power Street, which collectively contain eight rental dwelling units, in order to redevelop the lands with a 27-storey apartment building comprised of 453 dwelling units, including eight replacement rental units, on the first through 27th floors and commercial spaces on the first and second floors.

A Rental Housing Demolition and Conversion application (18 136700 STE 28 RH) under Section 111 of the *City of Toronto Act, 2006* (Chapter 667 of the Municipal Code) has been submitted to permit the demolition. Under the *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, the demolition of a rental property with six or more dwelling units is prohibited without obtaining a permit from the City. Decisions by City Council on the rental housing demolition application are not subject to appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal (OLT).

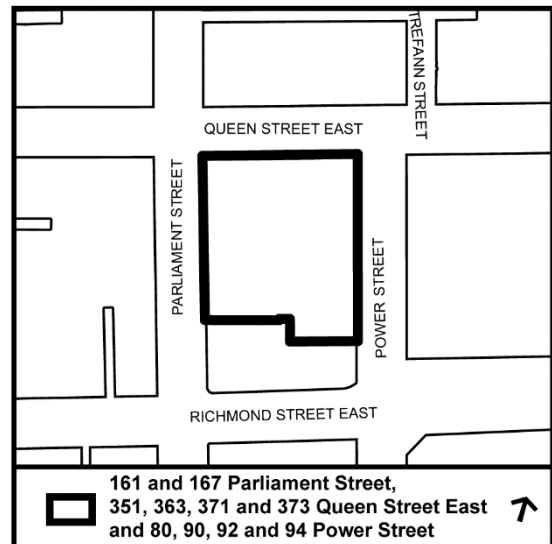
