# Overview of 2023 Operating Budget Submission

## Ontario Seniors Dental Care Program

- \$2.7 million increase for an annual budget of \$18.3 million

## Student Nutrition Program

- \$0.8 million increase for an annual budget of \$17.6M

# Overview of 2023 Operating Budget Submission

## 2022 Operating Budget Proposals

- Contingent on receiving funding from other orders of government
- Continued advocacy

## Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services

- Early Abilities Program Transition - \$13.9 million
- Healthy Babies, Healthy Children with an annual budget of \$19.2 million



# Overview of 2023 Operating Budget Submission

## Public Health Agency of Canada

- Toronto Voluntary Isolation Centre funded until March 31, 2023 with a budget of \$3.6 million

## Ministry of Health COVID-19 Funding

- School-Focused Nurses Initiative funded until June 30, 2023 with a budget of \$5.9 million
- General Response with an annual budget of \$49.1 million
- Mass Immunization Initiative with an annual budget of \$36.9 million

# Overview of 2023 Operating Budget Submission

## Other (Standard) Budget Adjustments

- Inflationary and Cost of Living Adjustments - \$3.7 million increase
- 2023 Administrative and Technical Adjustments - \$2.8 million impact

# Overview of 2023-2032 Capital Budget and Plan Submission

## 2023 Budget – \$5.1 million

- \$1.2 million – Ontario Seniors Dental Care Program
- \$0.3 million – Electronic Medical Record
- \$1.3 million – Infectious Diseases Management and Surveillance Information
- \$1.9 million – Inspection Management Implementation
- \$0.4 million – Community Health Information Systems Map-us Upgrade

## 2023-2032 – \$31.5 million

- 16 projects: 1 facilities and 15 information technology
