

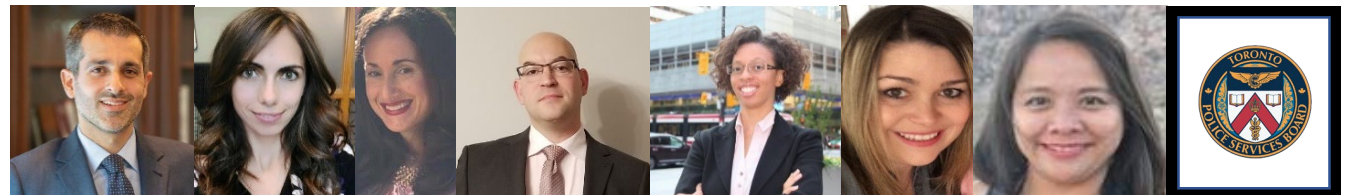


Civic Appointment Toronto Police Services Board

Toronto Police Services Board – Who Are We?



- *7 member Board that provides oversight and governance to the Toronto Police Service*
- *3 Appointees from the Province; 3 Appointees from City Council; 1 Civic Appointment*
- *The Board approves the budget and sets the policy direction for the Service, and hires the Chief, Deputy Chiefs, Chief Administrative Officer, Chief Information Officer*
- *Supported by an 8 member professional staff*

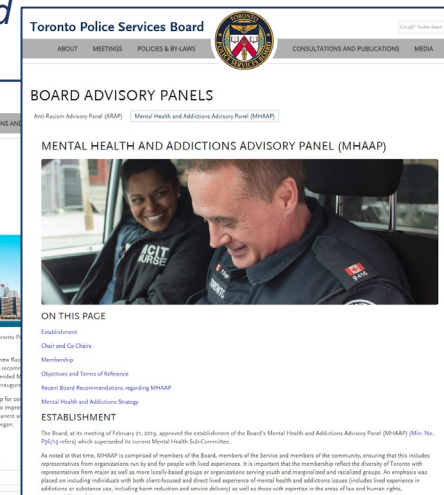
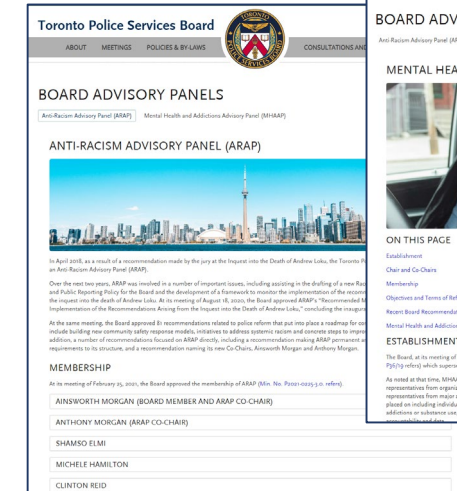
- 81 Recommendations

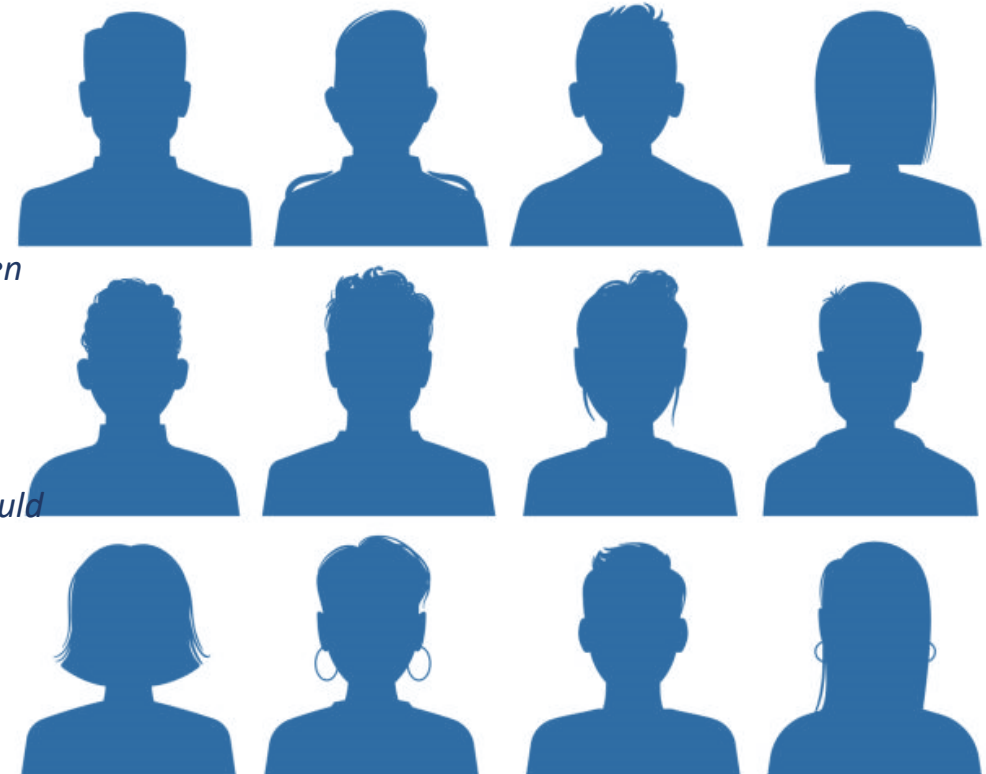

- *Governance experience and commitment to modernize police governance*
- *Demonstrated understanding of working within the municipal government context*
- *Understanding of the complex community safety needs of Toronto, and the approach of community safety and well-being*
- *Lived and community experience, especially within communities that have been underrepresented on our Board/in the Service*
- *An understanding of the many diverse communities of Toronto, their needs*
- *A keen understanding of anti-Black racism, anti-Indigenous racism, systemic racism and discrimination within the context of policing. Additionally, they would understand or have knowledge of equity, anti-oppressive, anti-racist, diversity and inclusion best practices*
- *Experience with large and/or complex budgets*
- *Experience with collective bargaining*
- *The ability to process large amounts of information quickly and identify gaps and questions that need to be asked*
- *A nuanced understanding of the unique challenges facing policing today*
