The High Park Movement Strategy will be before you on May 11th.

It has been my understanding that when voting on matters outside their Wards, Councillors tended to follow the recommendations of the Staff who prepared the reports. Due to a motion to change the recommendation made by staff on this report at committee, it does not reflect the fact that no where in the staff report do they recommend that High Park remain closed to cars. Closing the park to cars seems to have overshadowed all the hard work done by the city staff and the hired consultant and will result in the park remaining closed on weekends and statutory holidays which was not the recommendations made by staff. In strategy #3 they recommended putting in place- more TTC service, an accessible Shuttle, wider sidewalks and road adjustments for traffic calming, they mention that the elevator is being installed at High Park Subway but not until 2024!
