

Economic Development and Culture (EDC) Grants - 2020 and 2021 Allocation and Grant Reform

SUMMARY

As part of its work, the Economic Development and Culture (EDC) Division oversees a diverse portfolio of programs and services, which includes grants to support:

- local art programs, arts and cultural festivals, public art and cultural institutions;
- business retention and expansion activities, business improvement areas, sector development and international trade;
- tourism, and the film, music, and interactive digital media sectors; and,
- historical sites in Toronto.

In alignment with the City's strategic priority to invest in people and neighbourhoods, EDC grants support and enhance the business sectors and the cultural fabric of Toronto, helping make it a city that celebrates diversity. This report has a dual purpose: it provides information on the grants issued through EDC programs in 2020, which totalled \$38,518,803.73, and in 2021, which totalled \$38,719,470.06, and proposes changes to be implemented as part of EDC's overall reform of its grants programs.

While EDC grants are critical to the sustainability of organizations in the business and cultural sectors, efforts are needed to improve their accessibility, transparency and accountability. In 2018, EDC started an internal process to advance these objectives. Since then, EDC has been updating its approach to grant programs and practices, also in alignment with the City of Toronto's Community Grants Policy introduced in 2019. Informed by this process, changes have been implemented in specific programs, such as the Business Incubation and Commercialization Grant Program, as adopted by Council in April 2022, and the Cultural Festivals Funding Program, adopted by Council in November 2021. This report recommends further changes to grant programs and directed grants (targeted investments to address strategic and/or urgent needs such as COVID-19-related efforts), and outlines next steps.

Combined, the proposed changes chart a way forward to improve granting practices in EDC while recognizing the necessity of retaining a measure of flexibility to support Council priorities, incent innovation and address changing market conditions.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The General Manager, Economic Development and Culture recommends that:

1. City Council delegate authority to the General Manager, Economic Development and Culture, to allocate directed grants in a manner consistent with Attachment 2 to third party non-profit organizations or registered charities as defined in and in accordance with the City's Community Grants Policy up to a value of \$500,000 each out of its Council approved budget until the end of the grant cycle in December 31, 2023 and to negotiate, enter into and execute any funding agreements, including any amendment, renewal or extension agreements until the end of December 31, 2023, on such content, terms and conditions deemed necessary by the General Manager, Economic Development and Culture and in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor.
2. City Council request the General Manager, Economic Development and Culture to report annually to the Economic and Community Development Committee on all directed grants approved and issued through Recommendation 1.
3. City Council delegate authority to the General Manager, Economic Development and Culture to continue to offer event sponsorships to third parties including businesses, festivals, non-profit corporations, registered charities and educational institutions up to a value of \$500,000 each out of its current Council approved budget and to negotiate, enter into and execute any agreements, including any amendment, renewal or extension agreements until the end of December 31, 2023, on such content, terms and conditions deemed necessary by the General Manager, Economic Development and Culture and in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor.
4. City Council request the General Manager, Economic Development and Culture to report annually, for information, to the Economic and Community Development Committee on all event sponsorships issued through Recommendation 3.
5. City Council authorize the General Manager, Economic Development and Culture or other City division heads as appropriate, in consultation with the City Manager and the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer as appropriate, to: (a) apply for, receive funds and to negotiate, enter into and execute any agreements, including any amendment, renewal or extension agreements and any ancillary documents (with a value of up to \$500,000) with the Government of Canada, Government of Ontario and/or agencies of the federal and provincial governments in support of the City of Toronto's Corporate Strategic Plan and the Economic Development and Culture Division 2022-23 Strategic Directions and any subsequent strategic plans approved by Council; and (b) distribute these funds as may be stipulated in the governing funding agreement, which may reference the issuance of grants to third party non-profit or charitable organizations, in accordance with the City's Community Grants Policy and in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor until the end of the grant cycle in December 31, 2026.

6. City Council direct the General Manager, Economic Development and Culture, to report back to the Economic and Community Development Committee on a plan to align the three programs currently called the Cultural Hotspot, Youth Cultural Incubators Stabilization Initiative, and Live Arts Mentor programs, with the City's Community Grants Policy in Q3 2023.

7. City Council authorize the General Manager, Economic Development and Culture, or designate with the appropriate delegated commitment authority, to negotiate, enter into and execute grant agreements of up to \$500,000 for grants in support of the Toronto Music Industry Strategy 2022-2026 to third party non-profit or registered charities, as defined in and in accordance with the City's Community Grants Policy until December 31, 2023, on such content, terms and conditions deemed necessary by the General Manager, Economic Development and Culture, in consultation with the City Solicitor.

8. City Council direct the General Manager, Economic Development and Culture, to report back to the Economic and Community Development Committee with an update on aligning the Closed Museum Grant and the Toronto Railway Historical Museum Grant programs with the City's Community Grants Policy and Advancing Reconciliation, Equity and Inclusion - Re-imagining a New Future for Toronto History Museums Plan, and report back in Q1 2024.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

There are no current financial impacts arising from the recommendations contained in this report. Future financial impacts arising from the recommendations in this report will be accommodated within the Approved Operating Budget of the Economic Development and Culture Division.

As for any successful grant funding applications through recommendation 5, division heads must seek City Council approval for subsequent in-year budget adjustments at the next opportunity in order to provide City staff with spending authorities to achieve the intended purposes and outcomes as approved by City Council.

The Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer has reviewed this report and agrees with the information as presented in the Financial Impact Section.

EQUITY IMPACT STATEMENT

City of Toronto grants strategically advance social, economic and cultural goals. EDC recognizes the role grants play in supporting Toronto's business and cultural vibrancy, and that they can help build a more inclusive society. The grant reform, through the recommendations and changes proposed in this report, will improve equity through positive impacts on access to City information, City services, City spaces, and economic

development and training opportunities for Indigenous, Black and equity-deserving communities across Toronto neighbourhoods.

COMMENTS

EDC has a long history of supporting the dynamism of Toronto's business community and the arts and culture and heritage sectors through timely investments, incubation programs, and rapid support in times of crisis. Among the vital tools EDC uses to accomplish this are grants and event sponsorships. EDC offers two types of grants: (1) program grants, awarded as part of a structured and Council-approved program that includes a formal application process as required under the City's Community Grants Policy; and (2) directed grants, which are targeted investments that do not involve an application-process and/or are not part of a Council-approved program, and can be issued in a timely manner to address an urgent need or immediate opportunity aligned with City and divisional priorities.

Through the grant review process, EDC, working with key corporate partners in Internal Audit and Legal Services, determined that a significant number of what had historically been referred to as grants are, in fact, event sponsorships. Typically, the City as an event sponsor receives benefits from the sponsored entity to advance strategic priorities and key communications objectives, such as marketing considerations, visibility at the event and, often, an opportunity to present. In 2020, EDC sponsored events to support initiatives, music and cultural festivals, business networking events, and major conferences such as Elevate and Collision. Sponsoring these events helps advance Toronto's cultural vibrancy and livability in addition to creating business development opportunities in important sectors of the economy. EDC will report annually on recipients, amounts and outcomes of these event sponsorships.

Part 1 of this report outlines information on 2020 and 2021 grant allocation, as distributed by EDC programs and as required by the City's Community Grants Policy. Part 2 provides information on EDC's grant reform, outlining changes that have already occurred as part of the reform, additional recommended changes, and next steps.

1. EDC Grant Allocations - 2020 and 2021

Program Grants

In 2020, EDC distributed funds to 356 organizations and individuals in 16 program areas. As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, under direction of Council and the City Manager, EDC was mobilized to develop and deliver pandemic mitigation measures in support of the business and cultural sectors. As a result of such efforts, the grants allocated by EDC in 2020 do not reflect historical business practices or grant allocations made by EDC. A list of all 2020 and 2021 grantees by Program is found in Appendix A of this report.

Although short-and mid-term programs created to support business and culture sectors during the pandemic are captured in this report, one-time funds distributed as part of the

City's response to the pandemic are not captured. These initiatives have been reported through the City Manager's October 2021 COVID-19 Recovery and Rebuild Update. Directed Grants

In 2018, directed grants constituted approximately 3 percent or \$2.5 million of the Division's total budget of \$82 million gross. Due in large part to the COVID-19 pandemic, these payments grew. The global health crisis that began in early 2020 dramatically altered EDC's planned approach to grant reform as some programs, such as the ones associated with Tourism Services, had to cease planned activities, and other areas found themselves in high demand. The pandemic led to an increase in grants issued by EDC and demonstrated that one of the strengths of the Division is its ability to act nimbly and respond rapidly when needed. Examples of this include:

- support for the restaurant and hospitality sector during the pandemic, which resulted in the CafeTO program;
- Toronto's decision to host the Juno Awards, which provided a much-needed economic boost to Toronto's economy in 2021;
- grants to support Little Jamaica, which required immediate support due to the ongoing Eglinton Crosstown LRT project while other supports for the community are developed; and
- as demonstrated in Attachment 2, many of EDC's directed grants have been used to provide employment opportunities for Black and Indigenous Torontonians in the arts and culture sectors.

As the Juno initiative demonstrates, directed grants can be used to support initiatives that provide significant value to the City through an arrangement with a specific party. The Little Jamaica grants, in turn, highlight that directed grants can support community needs and strategic priorities while a new program is being developed. In such scenarios, it is important to flow funds in a timely manner, yet still guided by administrative rigour, best practices in client service, and alignment with City priorities.

The tables below highlight EDC's 2020 and 2021 directed grant spending. For 2022, EDC anticipates that these values will drop below pre-pandemic levels given that some directed grants have started and/or will start to be part of program grants, as noted in this report.

Directed grants noted as part of Program Support include sponsoring the Intergovernmental Committee for Economic and Labour Force Development (ICE), which was fully achieved through funds obtained from the federal government. In 2020, this totalled \$24,724. In 2021, this equalled a total amount of \$40,018.

2. EDC's Grant Reform

In 2018, EDC began a process of reforming its grant practices. At the request of the General Manager, the Internal Audit (IA) division conducted a review of EDC's grants and recommended the following process improvements:

- Consider strategies to communicate ad hoc grants to the public
- Formalize grant intake application processes
- Develop formal eligibility criteria to assess and document applicant eligibility
- Develop formal funding agreement templates outlining each party's responsibilities for grant funding

- Develop processes requiring funding recipients to provide outcome reports to the Division
- Assess whether funding provided is optimally meeting the Division's overall funding objectives

These recommendations aim to make EDC's grant process more equitable, inclusive, and transparent. The introduction of the City of Toronto's Community Grants Policy in 2019, in turn, provided new guidance and requirements for City of Toronto grants. Over the course of 2018 and 2019, EDC undertook a thorough review of its grants processes. However, this process was interrupted due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and subsequently resumed in 2022.

In addition to a review of grants, the first phase of grant reform involved implementing changes in existing programs. In 2019, Council approved the staff report entitled "Realignment of Two Cultural Grants Programs", which assessed the design, eligibility criteria, assessment process and intended outcomes of two programs, and transformed them into a new Cultural Festivals program. More recently, in 2022, Council approved the staff report entitled "Updating Toronto's Business Incubation and Commercialization Grant Program", which proposed changes to ensure that grants under this program are awarded in a transparent, open, and accountable manner.

This report is part of the second phase of the Division's grant reform process and seeks the delegated authority to use existing funds towards directed grants and to report back to Council annually on those allocations in addition to addressing specific authorities needed for individual program grants. Directed grants have provided EDC with the ability to act quickly in times of need, to make small, targeted investments in promising ideas, and to leverage those investments by supporting the scaling up of innovative ideas. In this sense, this report also aims to ensure that EDC can secure funds from other orders of government to offer more and/or scale up program and directed grants.

Finally, in the third and final phase of grant reform, in 2023 and 2024, EDC will bring forward reports proposing changes to seven program grants, namely:

- Cultural Access and Development Program
- Cultural Hotspot/ Youth Cultural Incubators Stabilization Initiative/Live Arts Mentor program
- Film and Interactive Digital Media
- Closed Museum Grant and Railway Historical Museum Grant

These proposed changes will allow EDC to ensure that its grants are equitable, transparent and in compliance with the City's Community Grants Policy.

Securing Funding to Use for Grants from Other Orders of Government

In order to access available funds from other orders of government and their agencies, EDC was directed by Council to work in alignment with the Toronto Office of Recovery and Rebuild (TORR) and seek grants focused on economic renewal and recovery. EDC sought and received the delegated authority from Council to apply for, distribute and administer grants from other orders of government. These funds have been particularly

important to EDC’s work in the Film and Entertainment Industries, securing a grant of \$800,000 in 2021 and 2022 to support workforce development initiatives with organizations such as the CEE Centre for Young Black Professionals, POV, Miziwe Biik, and film industry unions.

Obtaining funds from other orders of government, or re-profiling existing budgeted resources, has allowed EDC to support third-party organizations with either application-based or directed grants (funds obtained from other orders of government are not fully used for grants, also being partially allocated to administrative functions). In some instances, EDC used part of the funds to scale up initiatives, like ShowLoveTO - a set of activities created to encourage local tourism, promote community engagement, and foster economic recovery from the pandemic. In 2020 and 2021, the federal and provincial governments committed to the investments below, which reflect the value of signed contribution agreements (not actual funds received per year):

*Note: although approximately \$18M of these funds were announced in 2021, not all of these funds were dispersed in 2021 as grant allocations in some cases are multi-year agreements. In addition, \$15M (of the \$18M) were disbursed through application-based grants and not as directed grants.

Investment of federal funds in Toronto are, and may continue to be, a vital tool for post-pandemic recovery. The ability to leverage these investments to complement existing grant programs is essential given their impact on communities. Accordingly, this report seeks to extend the authority of City officials to apply for, distribute and administer grants from other orders of government until the end of this Council term, in 2026. If approved by Council, EDC will retroactively report on grants distributed, their impact, and EDC's success in aligning with the Toronto Community Grants policy, on an annual basis.

Next Steps in Grant Reform - 2023 and 2024

The next step of EDC's grant reform will focus on program grants, which are in the process of being updated to meet Internal Audit recommendations and comply with the City of Toronto Community Grants Policy. By taking this approach, all of the Division's program grants will have been evaluated and updated through the grant reform process by 2024, while EDC will still maintain some flexibility through directed granting.

Additional information on EDC grant programs currently going through changes noted in this staff report, and also noting next steps, are as follows:

- **Arts and Culture Services**

Cultural Hotspot, Youth Cultural Incubators Stabilization Initiative, and Live Arts Mentor
 These three programs, focused on cultural development outside the city core and supporting the next generation of arts leadership and organizations, run concurrently and have received funding through Council through the budget process. This report seeks delegated authority to enter into agreements on behalf of the City, which will support these programs. EDC will bring a staff report for Council consideration in Q3 of 2023 with an update. A brief summary of these programs is provided below:

- The Cultural Hotspot program, which began in 2014, was created as a result of a recommendation in the Council-approved Creative Capital Gains (CCG) Report in 2011. CCG stated that the City should develop a rotating Cultural Hotspot program to celebrate cultural activity in Toronto's neighbourhoods. The Cultural Hotspot program shines a spotlight on outside-the-core neighbourhoods, highlighting their vibrancy and cultural assets, and provides critical support to local artists and organizations to lead community-driven cultural initiatives that animate the spotlighted area(s) from June to October. In 2022, the Cultural Hotspot program moved to a hyperlocal model aligned with City priorities, focused on the communities of Golden Mile and Little Jamaica. In 2023, the Cultural Hotspot program will return to Little Jamaica and begin outreach in Jane and Finch, with a goal to invest in the community in 2023.

- The Youth Cultural Incubators Stabilization Initiative (YCISI) was launched in 2019 as a 3-year program to address critical risks facing a group of youth-serving arts organizations that were facing critical threats to their sustainability. Using a combination of direct investment and cohort learning, the program works to enhance the growth and long-term sustainability of Toronto's small/mid-sized arts organizations serving youth to move Economic Development and Culture's strategic priorities forward and ensure the development of the diverse creative talent that defines the City globally.
- Live Arts Mentor aims to build the capacity of the next generation of arts organizations that carry out arts programming and services for underserved communities and/or Toronto's Neighbourhood Improvement Areas.

- **Film and Entertainment Industries**

Music Sector Office

The Film and Music offices operate under the authority of two Council-directed and approved strategies. Both strategies highlight support to the music and film sectors through grants sponsorships of festivals and events. Additionally, grants are distributed to support workforce development and industry growth initiatives. City Council approved a renewed Music Strategy at its meeting on April 6, 2022. This report seeks the authority to enter into agreements on behalf of City Council and distribute those grants. These grants are typically in the form of event sponsorships totalling less than \$15,000. This funding is targeted and is intended to provide employment opportunities to musicians. In general, this refers to support for music festivals or initiatives that provide paid employment for musicians.

Film Sector Office

The Film Sector Office offers grants and event sponsorships primarily to small, independent film festivals. Typically, these include festivals that showcase the work of equity seeking groups. A significant portion of the Film Sector grant allocation is through partnership grants for workforce development. For these grants, funds have been sought and received from other orders of government. The remaining allocations are largely targeted event sponsorships of small, independent film organizations undertaking complementary workforce development or equity enhancing initiatives.

Interactive Digital Media and Tourism

In 2023 EDC will be bringing several reports for Council's consideration. These reports will cover the Film, Interactive Digital Media and Tourism sectors and will seek the delegated authority to support not-for-profit entities through grants and event sponsorships. As with the Music Sector Office, all grants and event sponsorships will be offered within the existing Film and Entertainment Industries' budget.

Previous staff reports on these areas have sought approval for strategic directions, and this staff report seeks the delegated authority to enter into agreements on behalf of the City. These agreements support the vitality of the film and music sectors and provide meaningful employment opportunities for artists.

- **Museums and Heritage Services**

Closed Museums Grant and the Railway Historical Museum

For a number of years, EDC has held the responsibility for grants that existed prior to amalgamation. These grants are funded out of the Arts and Culture grants portfolio. As EDC has moved to modernize museum spaces and collections, there is a need to address these grants, and engage the community in next steps.
