Updates to Chapter 441, Fees and Charges

Toronto City Council will be considering recommendations to adopt amendments to City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 441, Fees and Charges.

New User Fee for Vacant Home Tax:

Notice is given that the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer is recommending that the Council of the City of Toronto pass a by-law to amend Municipal Code Chapter 441, Fees and Charges, to implement a new fee for the administration of Vacant Home Tax. The new fee is proposed for failing to provide a declaration of occupancy status by the declaration due date. It is proposed that the by-law be adopted at the City Council meeting to be held on October 11, 12 and 13, 2023. Table 1 below sets out the proposed user fee for administration of Vacant Home Tax.
