Dear Honourable Premier Ford, Her Worship Mayor Chow, Respected Members of the Ontario Provincial Parliament, and Respected Members of Toronto City Council,

The Toronto Catholic District School Board (TCDSB) has always strived to teach our students through the Catholic Graduate Expectations, the importance of being a collaborative contributor who finds meaning, dignity and vocation in work which respects the rights of all, while contributing to the common good.

One such institution that has been contributing to the common good for decades is the former Gardiner Family Summer Resort (Basilian Fathers House), which includes the Marian Shrine of Gratitude. Located at 3100 Weston Road in Toronto, this property was initially purchased by Toronto philanthropist, Percy Gardiner and his wife Gertrude in the early 1920s. In 1950, the property was purchased by Jethro and Audrey Crang. Mr. Crang came from the turn of 20th century Toronto builders and was related to the Goulding and Boake families, who were pioneer families in Downsview.

This historical site was purchased on October 31, 1958, by the Order of Ukrainian Catholic Basilian Fathers and was the former site of St. Basil-The-Great High School which has produced many distinguished alumni who have contributed to the City of Toronto and Province of Ontario. The Marian Shrine of Gratitude created by Fr. Basil Cymbalisty, was a thank you gift to the community who supported him during the recovery from an eye accident. The significance of the Shrine is not only for residents of the local community, but also residents of Toronto, Ontario, Canada, as well as the countless international visitors who walk through the gates. Visitors include people of diverse ethnic origins, various nationalities, denominations, and cultures who visit the Shrine throughout the year to find peace and to give thanks.

The site is also important to many as a place of healing, especially for those who lost loved ones during the COVID-19 pandemic. The former Gardiner Family Summer Resort (Basilian Fathers House), including the Marian Shrine of Gratitude is also located on pristine conservation land.

During a Board of Trustee meeting on August 24, 2023, a motion was passed requesting that both the Government of Ontario and City of Toronto, designate the former Gardiner Family Summer Resort (Basilian Fathers House), including the Marian Shrine of Gratitude located at 3100 Weston Road in Toronto as a heritage site protected by the Ontario Heritage Act.
