Proposed Amendments to City Council Delegation to Community Councils Changes to Traffic Calming Measures and Polling Requirements

Amendments to City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 27, Council Procedures

The Infrastructure and Environment Committee and Toronto City Council will be considering a recommendation to pass a by-law to amend City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 27 (Council Procedures) in order to make changes to section §27-18.4B(9), Traffic Calming, and Community Councils' delegated authority to make final decisions Traffic Calming matters.

It is proposed that the by-law be adopted at the City Council meeting on November 8, 9 and 10, 2023 or at a subsequent meeting.

The report (October 12, 2023) General Manager, Transportation Services includes the following recommendation:

The General Manager, Transportation Services recommends that:

2. City Council amend §27-18.4B(9), Traffic Calming, of City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 27, Council Procedures, as follows:

a. by deleting from subsection (a)[3] the phrase: "Chicanes" and inserting the phrase: "Speed cushions";

b. by deleting from subsection (b) the phrase: "that do not have an established TTC route"; and

c. by deleting subsection (c):

"Despite Subsection B(9)b, the authority to waive petition and polling requirements under the City's Traffic Calming Policy for traffic calming proposals.".

If approved by City Council, City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 27 (Council Procedures) will require amendment.

At its meeting to be held on October 25, 2023 at 9:30 a.m. or as soon as possible thereafter, the Infrastructure and Environment Committee of Toronto City Council will hear in person by video conference, or by his or her counsel, agent or solicitor, any person who wishes to speak to the matter.
