Dear Deputy Mayor McKelvie and members of City Council,

I am writing in support of implementing the 8.6 centreline kilometres (km) of new bikeways across the city within the following five projects:

- Bloor Street West: Runnymede Road to Resurrection Road (cycle tracks, Ward 3 and 4)
- Bartlett-Havelock-Gladstone Cycling Connections project (Ward 9)
- Cabbagetown Cycling Connections project (Ward 13)
- Sheppard Avenue: Clairtrell Road to Leslie Avenue (cycle tracks, Ward 17)
- Superior Avenue: Lake Shore Boulevard and Stanley Avenue (cycle tracks, Ward 3), part of the Mimico Neighborhood Mobility project.

If Toronto is going to meet its TransformTO goal of having 75% of all trips under 5 km taken by biking, walking or taking transit by 2030, we need to implement safe cycling and pedestrian infrastructure across the city, especially in areas that lack access to safe active modes of transportation. To help expedite the work needed, I support the request by Transportation Services to streamline the reporting process for the by-law amendment submissions for all approved cycling infrastructure projects.

I hope that I can count on your unanimous support and vote in favour of the city staff recommendations outlined in their thorough 38 page report!
