Dear Mayor and Councillors,

Supporting small businesses in Toronto as they confront the aftermath of the pandemic is more important than ever.

The repayment deadline for the Canada Emergency Business Account (CEBA) loans is December 2023. Many local businesses have still not recovered from the pandemic and this rapidly approaching deadline will only worsen COVID-19s financial impact on small businesses.

Many will be forced to take on more debt to meet the December deadline and qualify for the \$20,000 in promised CEBA debt forgiveness. Others not able to pay in time will not only lose out on the \$20,000 in debt relief but also be charged interest on their CEBA loan.
