#### **PROPOSAL**

The applications to amend the Official Plan and Zoning By-law are for the properties at 2135 Sheppard Avenue East, 325 Yorkland Boulevard, 125 Consumers Road, 15 Smooth Rose Court, and 44 Smooth Rose Court. The applications propose an 11-storey mixed use building containing 279 residential dwelling units and approximately 3,079 square metres of non-residential space, as well as 457 square metres of on-site parkland dedication, for the property at 2135 Sheppard Avenue East.


### **FURTHER INFORMATION**

**If you wish to be notified** of the decision of the City of Toronto on the proposed Official Plan Amendment and Zoning By-law Amendment, and/or passing or refusal of the proposed Official Plan and Zoning By-law

Amendments, you must make a written request to the City Clerk, attention: Matthew Green, Administrator, at the address, phone number, fax number or e-mail set out above.

Official Plan and Zoning By-law Amendment Appeal: If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the City of Toronto to the Ontario Land Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Toronto before the proposed Official Plan Amendment is adopted or refused and/or the Zoning By-law Amendment is passed or refused, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision.

**People writing or making presentations at the public meeting:** The *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, the *Planning Act*, and the City of Toronto Municipal Code authorize the City of Toronto to collect any personal information in your communication or presentation to City Council or its committees.



The City collects this information to enable it to make informed decisions on the relevant issues. If you are submitting letters, faxes, e-mails, presentations or other communications to the City, you should be aware that your name and the fact that you communicated with the City will become part of the public record and will appear on the City's website. The City will also make your communication and any personal information in it - such as your postal address, telephone number or e-mail address - available to the public, unless you expressly request the City to remove it.

Many Committee, Board and Advisory Body meetings are broadcast live over the internet for the public to view. If you speak at the meeting you will appear in the video broadcast.
