PROPOSAL

The City is proposing to amend the Zoning by-law for the property at 140 Merton Street to facilitate a mixed-use development, including affordable housing, and community service space. The Zoning By-law Amendment is being advanced as part of the City's Housing Now Initiative.

The proposed amendments to the Zoning By-law for 140 Merton Street will permit a mixed-use building with one 29-storey (94 metres) residential tower providing for approximately 294 dwelling units, which includes housing for indigenous elders and other seniors. A minimum of 2,150 square metres of community space, and 46 parking spaces will be provided. Alterations of the heritage building are consistent with the approved heritage conservation strategy.



Zoning By-law Amendment Appeal: If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the City of Toronto to the Ontario Land Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Toronto before the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment is passed or refused, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision.



People writing or making video presentations at the public meeting: The *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, the *Planning Act*, and the City of Toronto Municipal Code authorize the City of Toronto to collect any personal information in your communication or presentation to City Council or its committees.
