#### PROPOSAL

City-wide Zoning By-law 569-2013 and the Former General Zoning By-laws are proposed to be amended by expanding live music and other entertainment use permissions inside eating and drinking establishments (from a maximum of 6 percent of the interior floor area of the establishment to 25 percent), removing existing amusement arcade conditions, adding amusement arcade to the list of entertainment-related uses limited to 400 square metres, removing permitted maximum amusement devices in entertainment places of assembly, sports places of assembly, and recreation uses, permitting nightclubs outside the downtown area in the Commercial Residential (CR) and Commercial Residential Employment (CRE) Zones (subject to conditions), updating entertainment-related definitions, and amending area-specific entertainment by-laws as required.

**Zoning By-law Amendment Appeal:** If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the City of Toronto to the Ontario Land Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Toronto before the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment is passed or refused the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision.

**People writing or making presentations at the public meeting:** The *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, the *Planning Act*, and the City of Toronto Municipal Code authorize the City of Toronto to collect any personal information in your communication or presentation to City Council or its committees.

The City collects this information to enable it to make informed decisions on the relevant issue(s).
