Dear Chair Bradford and Councillors:

The North York Community Preservation Panel would like to indicate its strong support for the inclusion of <u>33 Melrose Avenue</u> (including <u>31 Melrose Avenue</u>) on the Heritage Register.

Although the present Dewi Sant Welsh United Church dates from 1960, the congregation was founded in 1909 and was originally entirely Welsh speaking. It is a fine example of a church in the Modern style and its manse is a representative example of an early vernacular style residence. According to research by the North Toronto Historical Society, the manse probably dates to the 1880s and was originally a building on the St. Germain estate which extended from Yonge St. to Bathurst St. Alfred St. Germain was a prominent Toronto newspaperman and was involved with one of Toronto's first automobiles in the late 1890s. This property is featured as a site on the North Toronto Historical Society's walking tour – the "Village of Bedford Park Walk".
