The Mayor and Members of Toronto City Council are deeply saddened to learn of the passing of Michael Peter Nevin on November 20th, 2022, at the age of 79.

Michael devoted his life to advocating for both his own community, and for the world at large.

As a long-time member of the Bain Co-op, Michael sat on its Residence Committee and championed its community library and composting programs. He was also a dedicated activist in global affairs, being as strong voice for nuclear disarmament while serving on the Hiroshima Nagasaki Day Coalition.

Michael was widely recognized for his generous spirit and innovative mind. Through his work as the Compost Facilitator for Foodshare Toronto, Michael received a Dedication Award from the Bhayana Family Foundation for community-based, mid-scale all-season composting.

Later in life, Michael continued to roll out composting programs for Toronto District School Board properties and was deemed Toronto Food Policy Council's Local Food Hero for his highly valued community work. In these and in many other ways, Michael exemplified meaningful community living.

Michael will be deeply missed by his community and by his children Dera Jardine Nevin and Remington Lee Nevin.
