Ernie was also a great supporter of Reena, helping to create housing for individuals with developmental disabilities including the new housing project on Elm Ridge Drive.

Ernie was a supreme storyteller, and was full of wisdom with a wealth of experience and insight about different topics. He loved reminiscing about the TriBell Club he founded and his days spent in Hallandale Beach, Florida. Most of all, Ernie loved spending time with his family and making others laugh with a good joke, and his great sense of humour always lit up a room.

Ernie was incredibly proud of his son, Joel, and his daughter, Ellen, and never stop loving his beloved late wife, Sharon whom he was married to for 70 years. Cherished grandfather and great-grandfather, loving brother and brother-in-law, uncle and great-uncle. Ernie will be deeply missed by his extended family and numerous friends.
