NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING

PROPOSAL

The application proposes to demolish a total of 33 rental dwelling units—32 units at 1625, 1633 and 1641 Kingston Road and 1 unit at 52 Birchcliff Avenue. The application proposes to redevelop the lands with two new buildings comprising 312 new dwelling units, including replacement rental units for all 33 demolished rental units. Tenant relocation and assistance is proposed to mitigate hardship for impacted eligible tenants.

A Rental Housing Demolition and Conversion application (20 203480 ESC 20 RH) under Section 111 of the *City of Toronto Act, 2006* (Chapter 667 of the Municipal Code) has been submitted to permit the demolition. Under the *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, the demolition of a rental property with six or more dwelling units is prohibited without obtaining a permit from the City. Decisions by City Council on the rental housing demolition application are not subject to appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal (OLT).
