City-initiated Proposal to Amend the Official Plan, including changes to Site and Area Specific Policy 236, as part of the Woodside Square Planning Review Application No. 19 182375 ESC 23 TM

PROPOSAL

The Woodside Square Planning Review was initiated in 2019 as required by Site and Area Specific Policy 236, when the landowner of Woodside Square expressed a desire to explore additional development opportunities for the site. Site and Area Specific Policy 236 requires that a planning review be undertaken to the satisfaction of City Council before new uses can be permitted on the lands.

The City-initiated Official Plan Amendment proposes to delete and replace Site and Area Specific Policy (SASP) 236 which would permit additional uses, including residential uses, and guide future development on the lands at 1571 Sandhurst Circle. The SASP was developed through the Woodside Square Planning Review and draft policy directions were presented to City Council in a Proposals Report dated April 4, 2022 (SC31.11).

This land is also subject to an application under the *Planning Act* for an amendment to the City-wide Zoning By-law 569-2013, Application Number 20 151730 ESC 23 OZ.

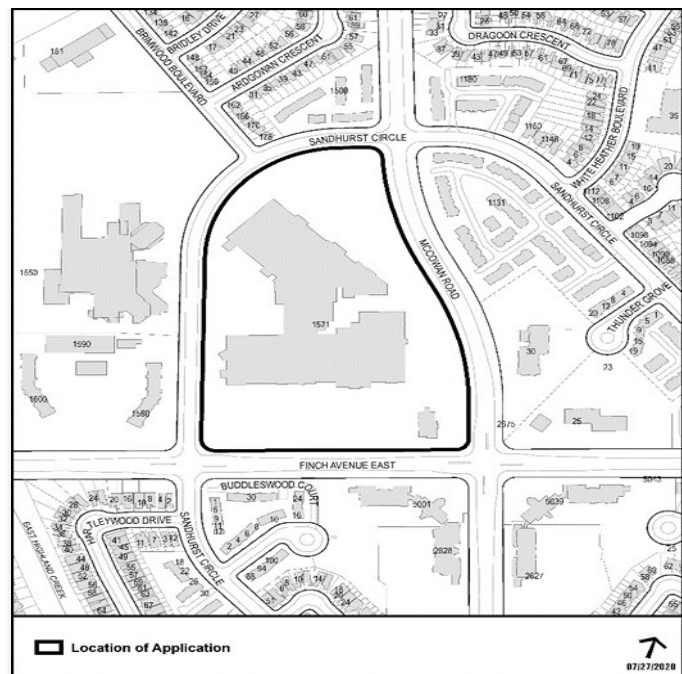
If you wish to be notified of the decision of the City of Toronto on the proposed Official Plan Amendment, you must make a written request to the City Clerk Attention: Nancy Martins, Administrator, Scarborough Community Council at the address, fax number or e-mail set out above.

Official Plan Amendment Appeal: If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the City of Toronto to the Ontario Land Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Toronto before the proposed Official Plan Amendment is adopted or refused, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision.

If a person or public body does not make oral submission at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of Toronto before the proposed Official Plan Amendment is adopted or refused the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Land Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.

People writing or making presentations at the public meeting: The *City of Toronto Act, 2006*, the *Planning Act*, and the City of Toronto Municipal Code authorize the City of Toronto to collect any personal information in your communication or presentation to City Council or its committees.

The City collects this information to enable it to make informed decisions on the relevant issue(s). If you are submitting letters, faxes, e-mails, presentations or other communications to the City, you should be aware that your name and the fact that you communicated with the City will become part of the public record and will appear on the City's website. The City will also make your communication and any personal



information in it - such as your postal address, telephone number or e-mail address - available to the public, unless you expressly request the City to remove it.

Many Committee, Board and Advisory Body meetings are broadcast live over the internet for the public to view. If you speak at the meeting you will appear in the video broadcast.
