

Appointment of Public Members to the Aboriginal Affairs Advisory Committee (AAAC)

➤ Background

- On May 22, 2024, City Council adopted the updated Aboriginal Affairs Advisory Committee (AAAC) Terms of Reference.
- The AAAC will be composed of up to 25 public members and one Member of City Council.
- Given the Toronto Aboriginal Support Services Council (TASSC) experience with past AAACs and its connections in community, the public members will be representatives of member agencies of TASSC and Indigenous organizations identified by the City and/or TASSC.

Recommended Public Member Appointments

- The report seeks Council's authority to appoint 20 public members to the AAAC for a term of office ending on November 14, 2026.
- The list of 20 nominees was provided by TASSC and consists of representatives of member agencies of TASSC and Indigenous organizations identified by TASSC.

Next Steps

- Once approved by CAC and City Council, the City Manager's Office and City Clerk's Office will continue to work with TASSC and support the AAAC to plan a meeting in the fall.
